GATHER

We will gather in person at the New Dorp Staten Island Railway station and walk to New Dorp High School (465 New Dorp Lane, Staten Island, NY 10306) from there.

UNDERSTAND

New Dorp is a neighborhood on the east shore of Staten Island. New Dorp is bounded by Mill Road on the southeast, Tysens Lane on the southwest, Amboy and Richmond Roads on the northwest, and Bancroft Avenue on the northeast.

New Dorp was originally the home of the Raritans and subgroups of the Lenape tribe. In 1671, the Dutch built the settlement known as New Dorp. New Dorp experienced an inflow of immigrants from France, England, and Italy. More recently, Latinos and Asians have moved into the area.

Multi-ethnic composition, convenient public transportation, and local small businesses are factors contributing to New Dorp's vibrancy. Small shops are run by local residents: unique local stores selling children's clothes, homemade cupcakes, and decorative materials. There are many ethnic restaurants, and the crime rate is low.

Key Demographics:

- The population of New Dorp-Midland Beach is 21,896.
- The racial makeup of the neighborhood is 78.3% White, 1.2% African American, 0.1% Native American, 5.2% Asian, 1.1% other and mixed race. Hispanic / Latino of any race were 14%.
- Median household income in Community District 2 is \$81,487. An estimated 14% of New Dorp / Mid-Island residents live in poverty.
- 20% are between the ages of 0–17, 25% between 25–44, and 29% between 45–64.
